

Tenure-track Faculty Position in Business Administration (Law) Western Colorado University

POSITION: Western Colorado University invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track faculty in Business Administration (law). Teaching responsibilities include: legal environment of business, business law, water law, environmental law, and other law-related courses. Teaching courses in the business core, in the candidate's area of expertise, is possible. Responsibilities include teaching 24 semester credits per year, academic advising, program building/recruiting, service to the university, and continued professional development.
